One more episode (12) has been produced but after this things are in the air due to high production costs.

On 15th we were visited by Mark Haynes MØDXR Area Sales Manager of the Communications Division of JVCKENWOOD In the first part of his talk Mark gave an overview of the history of Kenwood. It was established in 1946 as the Kasuga Radio Co. Ltd. in Japan, and in 1960 the company was renamed Trio Corporation. In the early 1960s the name Kenwood was invented by Kasuga as being the combination of "Ken", a name common to Japan and America that had been tested and proven acceptable to American consumers the name of Kenmore Appliances, and "Wood", referring to the durable substance as well as suggesting a relation to Hollywood.

JVCKENWOOD was more recently formed by the merger of JVC's parent company with Kenwood

Within their Communications Division there is a split of 90%

PMR which includes prestigious collaboration with McLaren in Formula 1 and communications systems within major retail groups. The remaining 10% of the Division is accounted for by Amateur Radio. As for JVC, the emphasis is more on televisions, projectors and docking stations etc. Mark showed us slides of Kenwood transceivers ranging from vintage to modern, and members tried with varying degrees of success to identify them.

Mark advised of his targets within JVCKENWOOD which are summarised as:

- · Attend major trade and dealer events
- · Deliver a reliable responsive service to customers
- Develop a shack at London HQ
- · Interact with the Ham community
 - Revise and release firmware
 - Grow the business
- · Sponsor special events e.g. by loaning equipment
- · Support the newly licensed

This section of the evening was concluded by an overview of the new TH-D74E dual band handheld working on the D-STAR platform and with all mode HF receive, followed by a video of the flagship

During questions Mark was able to say that not one of these rigs had been returned to Kenwood UK due to any production faults. In the second part of the evening Mark spoke passionately about his special interest in the hobby - DXpeditioning (Note his call sign MØDXR!). By way of example he referred to the CQ World Wide Contest 2015 where he worked in the category of "single op all band" as TI5W from the QTH of N3KS (Kam) in Costa Rica. This is a good location for ARRL contests as the land drops away to the north.

As well as the separately fed HF bands covered by antenna on the tower there is also a pair of 80m verticals with multiple radials. TIW5 was operating at the full legal maximum of 1500 Watts and the duration of the contest was 48 hours. However, there was a power outage 28 hours in and the station's generators did not fire up, so there was a brief loss of opportunity until they were fixed.

Mark explained the points system and the tactical nature of the contest. He wanted both to make contacts

with the same Amateurs on different frequencies to obtain "multiplier" points and to secure contacts from Europe and Japan (3 points) rather than the USA (2 points). He was operating from two identical radios and logging with two keyboards alternately. Operating two radios interleaving transmissions is his currently preferred method known as Single Operator Two Radio (SO2R) Style. His final score was 9,903,740 points, but he is all set to return to the same location next March to try and better that, and indeed to go for the record.
